

U3A Network Queensland Art Exhibition 2023

Theme: *'U3A Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow'*

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. What may I use to create my collage?

A. Any material is acceptable, including paint with at least one other type of material, or a mix of materials (paper or fabric for example). However, photographs arranged as a collage using a computer software program will not be accepted.

Q. What is a high-resolution photograph?

A. The term "high resolution" refers to the **dimensions of an image**. An image with high resolution has many pixels and therefore has good detail and clarity. Images with low resolution have few pixels, resulting in images that are blurry or jagged (pixelated).

Q. Do I need a good camera to take a high-resolution photograph?

A. No, but you do need to check the settings. Your U3A may have a class tutor who can help with this.

Q. I don't know anything about photography so where can I find help?

A. Contact your local U3A and ask if anyone there can help. Is there a photography tutor who can take the photo for you? Or ask a young person – a friend or family member.

Q. I don't use the internet for banking so how can I pay my entry fee?

A. Go into any BOQ branch and fill in a deposit slip, using the details on the entry form. Ask for your full name to be inserted on the reference line. You will receive a deposit receipt.

Q. I don't have a computer so how can I fill in the entry form?

A. Your local U3A may be able to help, or a friend or family member may do this for you. If you have a printed copy of the entry form, fill it in by hand and whoever helps you to send it will scan it and email it to us with the photograph of your entry.

Q. I don't have an email address so how can I enter?

A. Ask your local U3A or a friend if they will send an email for you. Your name and phone number will go into the body of the email and your details on the entry form so we will know the entry is from you.

Q. I don't attend an art class at U3A. Am I able to enter?

A. Yes, you are welcome to enter even if you do not attend a class at your U3A, but you must be a member of one of the U3As in Queensland.

Q. What is a blurb?

A. A short description of your artwork, mentioning how you used the words of the theme for your inspiration. It does not have to be exactly 25 words.
