Join us in Rockhampton for the U3A Network Queensland Conference and 50th Anniversary of U3A worldwide.

U3A Rockhampton and District Conference Committee has brought together an inspiring lineup of speakers from different backgrounds and specialities who will celebrate what has been achieved in the last 50 years of the University of the Third Age, and focus on what exciting things we, in our third age, have to look forward to.

8th May, the conference will open with a Meet & Greet event to be held at the new Rockhampton Museum of Art.

9-11th May, the conference will commence at Central Queensland University with Professor François Vellas (*pictured right*) - ‘U3A in the Beginning and our Future’.

Professor Vellas is the President of the International Association of Universities of Third Age (AIUTA) and Director of the University of Third Age (U3A) of Toulouse, France. He is a PhD in Economics and UN/EU/WTO expert in Elderly and Tourism Policy and Strategy.

Professor Vellas is the son of founding member, Professor Pierre Vellas, and he will reminisce about his father’s innovative idea that led to the formation of U3A, and as the current President of AIUTA, he will describe how far the organisation has come, as well as plans for its future.

Professor Vellas will be joined in his speech, via video link, by Prof. Maria Chester, Secretary General of AIUTA, addressing ‘U3A Today’.

Maria, (*pictured below*) was born in Buenos Aires, and has travelled the world, and is currently living in Scotland.

After studying Fine Arts, Maria delved further into Art History, becoming a Professor in Pre-Columbian

Civilisations. From her first passion, Cave Art and Rock Art, Professor Chester developed an interest in archaeology, and this has served as a frame for her ongoing research.


